Fly solo in 10 days?

The flying scholarships offer the chance to learn to fly through the award of 12 flying hours in light aeroplanes towards the achievement of a National Private Pilot's Licence. The majority of scholarships will be flown on a residential basis from selected flying schools. Selection is based on a formal application and, after short-listing, either an interview at the Trust's offices in London or on aptitude tests and interview at the Officers and Aircrew Selection Centre, RAF Cranwell during March/April 2008. Air Cadets are eligible for special awards.

Applicants must be 17 but under 26 on 1 April 2008

Experience aerospace engineering?

The engineering scholarships provide placements in the UK aerospace industry for one or two weeks for young men and women considering careers as aerospace engineers.

Applicants must be 17 but under 26 on 1 April 2008.

Develop your gliding skills?

The gliding scholarships offer cross-country gliding, aerobatic gliding or SLMG flying to gain flying experience and new qualifications. Applicants must be 16 but under 26 on 1 April 2008.

Fly a balloon?

The Breitling balloon scholarship offers training leading to the award of a PPL (Balloons) with training being co-ordinated by Brian Jones, who circumnavigated the earth with Bertrand Piccard in Breitling Orbiter 3. Applicants must be 17 but under 26 on 1 April 2008.

Improve your licence?

The flying bursaries provide 5-8 hours advanced flying training in single-engine piston aeroplanes, to assist licensed pilots gain additional flying qualifications or to renew a rating.

There are no age limits but most bursaries go to applicants under 30.
