Safety

GASCo Safety Evenings. GASCo has announced the first set of dates and venues for its 2015/6 series of Safety Evenings. So far, 15 dates have been announced with another 15 currently being considered. This year, the evenings will examine the six areas of greatest concern to General Aviation in the UK - the GA Safety Six - which feature in the CAA Safety Plan for 2014 to 2017. Regulatory

Second ANO Consultation. The CAA has opened its second and final consultation on potential changes to the Air Navigation Order. Responses to the previous consultation, which are detailed in the consultation documents, were "extremely supportive" of the principles of the review. As a result, the new consultation makes detailed proposals on changes to the rules and regulations for pilot licensing, operations and airworthiness with a view to deregulating or delegating where possible in order to simplify compliance for GA pilots and organisations. Competitions and Cross-Country

Inter-Club League. The final of the Inter-Club League was held at the Gliding Centre, Husbands Bosworth on the weekend of 5th/6th September. The hosts and defending champions came out top with Bristol & Glos GC second and Essex & Suffolk GC third. A fuller report will appear in S&G.

New Junior Champion. Stefan Astley (London GC) is the new British Junior Champion. Tom Arscott (Lasham GS) and Sam Roddie (Wolds GC) were second and third respectively in the event held last month at Aston Down.

- Club Class: Wolds GC (Pocklington), 28th May 5th June;
- Standard and 20m Multi-Seat Classes: Cotswold GC (Aston Down), 18-26th June;
- 15m and Open Classes: Lasham GS, 30th July 7th August
- 18m Class: Venue TBA, 20-28th August;
- Juniors: The Gliding Centre (Husbands Bosworth), 20-28th August.

Women Pilot Opportunity. The British Women Pilots' Association (BWPA), in partnership with Women Glide UK, is offering a £500 bursary for improving your cross-country flying next year, for example by completing your Cross-Country endorsement or Part-FCL pilot licence, doing some advanced XC training or entering a rated competition. RAeC Trust Bursaries. The Royal Aero Club Trust has announced details of its 2016 Bursary Scheme. The 2016 bursaries include The President's Scholarships (2 bursaries each worth up to £750); the Peter Cruddas Foundation Scholarship worth up to £1,000; the Breitling Bursary worth up to £750; the MacRobert Trust Bursaries (2 bursaries each worth up to £500); and the Bramson Bursary, as well as a number of additional bursaries worth up to £500 each. These are available to anyone between 14 and 21 years of age wishing to develop their interest in either air sports or aviation. Additionally, "Follow on Bursaries" are available to assist committed applicants, aged up to 24, reach even higher levels of achievement through, for example, participation in national and international competitions. Note that the closing date for applications to be received at the RAeC is 31st March 2016. These need to be countersigned by a sponsor such as your CFI and submitted via the BGA. Award for Max Bishop. Congratulations to Max Bishop, who was appointed as an FAI Companion of Honour at the recent FAI General Conference. Max, who first soloed in 1964 and who has all 3 Diamonds, was the FAI Secretary from 1993 to 2010. He has also held several positions within the FAI Aviation and Space Education Commission including UK Delegate and President. He is the current Vice-President of the International World Games Association (IWGA) where the FAI is active with several air sports.

Peter Lanyon Exhibition. A major exhibition of the gliding paintings of Peter Lanyon opens at the Courtauld Gallery in London on 15th October. The exhibition features 15 works of one of the major 20th century British painters, who produced radical, near-abstract paintings of the tough coastal landscape of his native Cornwall, inspired by his experience of gliding. RAeS Light Aircraft Design Conference. The Royal Aeronautical Society is holding its annual light aircraft design conference in London on 16th November. The programme will provide a mix of practical and thought provoking papers. Topics will include detail design issues, advances in manufacturing with composites and funding for small enterprises and an appraisal of how flight simulators can help in the design process and possibly support an approach to fly-by-wire for General Aviation. More inspiration for innovators in control systems may be gained from studies into insect flight.
