Airspace

Red Arrows Calendar. The Red Arrows display schedule for 2016 is now available at http://www.raf.mod.uk/reds/displays/displaydates.cfm. As always, please respect the areas of temporarily restricted airspace - RA(T) -that are established for these. Glasgow-Stornoway Route. When UK Class F Airspace was replaced in 2014, the old Class F route A1D (Glasgow - Stornoway) was disestablished. However, passenger-carrying commercial flights continue to operate routinely on this direct route at wave flying altitudes. Official charts and available electronic files have nothing to indicate the presence of this activity. As a purely voluntary initiative we have asked Geoff Brown to add the route to the files which generate our moving maps. Note that this is not controlled airspace. You do not have to avoid it. But please be aware that it is an area where you may find small airliners; it would therefore be good airmanship to keep an extra good look out, listen out on 127.275 and ideally give Scottish West Coast a call on that frequency to tell them where you are. Our intention is simply to minimise the risk of possible conflict - and to do that in a way that maintains everyone's freedoms in a positive way. Solent CTA Airspace Release. We have just heard that the CAA has approved the FASVIG proposals to disestablish a portion of controlled airspace within the Solent Control Area (CTA), in accordance with the CAA policy for the Release of Controlled and Segregated Airspace. The proposals, which will see the base level of CTA-6 raised to 3,000ft amsl, releasing 500ft to Class G airspace, will be implemented on 26th May 2016. Although the change may not directly impact gliding operations, we are encouraged by this decision as it bodes well for other proposals that we are actively engaged in with FASVIG.

Regulatory

New (Simpler) Medical Requirements for NPPL and UK PPL. Following consultation, the CAA has announced that, from late summer (exact date not yet announced), the medical requirement for UK PPL and NPPL licence holders will be to meet the same standard as that required to hold a DVLA Group 1 Ordinary Driving Licence. Pilots will simply need to complete a form on the CAA website to declare that they meet the DVLA medical standard, removing the need for GP or AME involvement, although existing medical options will still remain available. Pilots under 70 will need to make the declaration once while pilots over 70 must confirm their declaration every three years. The CAA is also aiming to influence EASA in considering reviewing the medical requirements for EASA Private Pilot licence holders flying EASA aircraft.

Adding a Privilege to an Existing Part-FCL Licence. Pilots who hold a UK CAA-issued EASA SPL or LAPL(S) may now apply to add additional privileges to their licence based on BGA training and experience. Competitions and Cross-Country

International Successes. Mike Young and Jon Gatfield finished 4th and 5th respectively in the Spanish Sailplane GP, held at Cerdanya. Full results are at http://www.sgp.aero/spain2016/. British pilots achieved some great results against top international pilots in the Hahnweide competition which was held in southern Germany at the start of the month. Howard Jones and Tim Scott finished second in the Standard and 15m Classes respectively with Derren Francis (18m) and Andy and Matt Davis (20m Two Seater) also achieving top 10 finishes. Notable Flights. The last month saw possibly the best start to the season for many years. Roger Barber (Lasham GS) did a 752km flight on 23rd April, followed by a 512km flight the following week and then a 628km flight on 3rd May. Four further pilots - Garry Coppin, David Masson, Roy Pentecost (all Lasham) and Andy Smith (Cotswolds) - all achieved three 500k+ flights over the same period. In total, there were no fewer than 57 500k+ flights between 17th April and 3rd May. On May 5th, Nick Norman along with co-pilot Moritz Korn (Cairngorm GC) achieved a height gain of 25,427ft, reaching a maximum height of 28,534ft, setting a new club record in the process. Competition Rules. With the release of a new version of the IGC Procedures for Handicapped Classes, it has become necessary to issue an update to the BGA Competition Rules. This new version also includes a change to the use of Timeout Distance (Dt) in AAT scoring. Waypoint List Amendments. A revision of the 2016 Waypoint list has been published. This includes new extra waypoints around the Cambridge area. These points have been developed by the Competitions Committee in conjunction with Cambridge ATC to provide well-placed alternatives to some existing TPs that will help interoperability between gliders and powered aircraft in this busy and sensitive area and give competition task setters extra options.
