Previous Minutes

The minutes from the meeting on the 18th Dec 2020 were agreed as correct by the committee.

Actions Review

All actions due for this meeting have been completed.

IGC Proposals

BSp provided the committee with proposed changes to the IGC rules in regard to the WWGC2019 competition. It was agreed that the committee members will individually provide changes to BSp if required.

IGC Bids

BSp provided the committee with voting issues for the 2020 Plenum. The committee agreed with the following:

Year-2 Proposals

6.1.1 Maximum Period and Minimum Separation of Events (Netherlands) Proposal to ensure the Cat 1 events run from Saturday to a Saturday prize giving allowing time to travel home on the Saturday and Sunday. *Vote For* 6.1.2 Digital Safety Registration System (Netherlands)

Requirement to use an anonymous digital reporting system for incidents etc. *Vote For*

6.1.4 Pilot Event Marker start procedure (Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Poland) Procedure proposed:-

When ready to take a start, the competitor will press the event marker on his *Primary* and *Alternate* flight recorders (FR). Time between primary and alternate event markers must be less than 1 minute and primary should always be depressed first.

The Event Marker may be pushed before the opening of the start gate, but the actual start recorded must be after the start gate is opened otherwise there is not a valid start.

WAITING TIME.

The pilot must wait a set time (**Waiting Time**) after pushing the PEV before the Start Window commences. The Waiting Time is announced on the task sheet, and must be between 7 to 10 minutes.

START WINDOW

The duration of the **Start Window** is also announced on the Task sheet and will be between 5 to 10 minutes. The pilot may start at any time during the Start Window and the start time will be the actual time of the start. The sum of Waiting Time + Start Window must not be less than 15 minutes to avoid congestion in the start area.

RE-START

To make another start, the pilot must once again push the PEV on all FR. The WAITING TIME re commences from the push of the PEV, and the Start Window opens at the end of the Waiting Time, as usual.

6.2.3 Distance Handicap Task (DHT). Applicable to Club Class and other handicapped classes. Sets a variable turnpoint circles based on glider handicap for Racing Task.

6.1.6 Early Bird Bonus (UK, Australia)

8.2.2.1 Early Bird Bonus Points:

The "early bird start procedure" may be used on any competition day, as detailed on the task sheet and advised at briefing.

A competitor will have "start procedure points" deducted from his score if starting after the free start time. The free start time is announced at briefing and must be not less than 20 mins or more than one hour after the start gate opening time.

Pilots starting after the end of the free start time will have 3 points deducted for each minute up to a maximum of 90 points. On days with less than maximum speed points the points per minute will be reduced in direct proportion to the maximum number of speed points on that competition day *Agreed by the committee*

6.1.7 Place Scoring System (Australia)

Optional alternative scoring system.

8.4.3 Place based scoring

Following determination of relative placing, points are then awarded based on the placing as per the following: 1 point for each competitor that completes the task

□ 1 point for each competitor that you beat

 \Box ½ point for each competitor that you draw with (equal performance).

□ 1 bonus point for placing first. If two or more competitors are equal first, each shall score 1 bonus point. *Vote For if amended to 1 point for each finisher you beat*

To include in Annex A an Open class AAT task with enhanced distance scoring to be called,

Pilots who exceed 95% of the Maximum possible task distance from their selected Start point his credited time will be his real time, not the Minimum Task Time. *Vote For*

WWGC 2021

IB informed the committee that the BGA is working series of objectives and outcomes the BGA would like to see. As a part of these objectives, the BGA would like to use WWGC2021 to improve competition gliding within the UK. Three propositions for improvement are as follows:

One to talk about - Delivering something to improve the uk gliding comp team

- Tugs
- Task setters
- Weather

<u>Tugs</u>

It was suggested that there is an official tug database produced

<u>Tasks setting</u>

It was suggested that a task setting guide should be produced

Committee agreed focus is needed on AAT's more than distance tasks.

<u>Weather</u>

Weather briefings were discussed and the committee was in agreement that most pilots can selfbrief so a professional meteorologist is not necessarily important, and a better way forward could be for someone to do the briefing in a self-briefed style and provide this as a weather briefing for the pilots.

IB requested input from the rest of the committee about other possible activities that would better benefit gliding as a whole with the following suggestion:

Media- As the WWGC2021 will be utilising consultants for social media, it was suggested that a media guide should be created for use by clubs and competitions. This would aid in advertising gliding as an accessible sport to a wider audience.

Proposal from Liz Sparrow

Liz Sparrow provided a proposal to the committee for a selection system for pilots for the WWGC21 similar to that of Junior World Gliding Competitions. This was discussed at length by the committee with the outcome being the committee agreeing to remove the requirement of 550 rating points and having a similar approach to the selection of the juniors British team for WWGC21.

Seminar Planning

Rules Feedback

AL presented the committee with responses of feedback for the 2020 rules. These were discussed and the following was agreed:

Turbo Test – Concern of gliders descending at release height in amongst releasing gliders and tugs. Agreed to revert the rule to its original wording but with a time limit of 60 seconds of engine running.

Farnborough TMZ – Agreed that this needs to be penalty

6.2.2 - change to just say annex a of IGC plus any additional requirements from the BGA

Frequencies – Agreed to the re-wording from MP

Stewards - change so that the stewards may contact the committee

BGA Strategy Review

AL provided an update of the strategy document and requires input from the rest of the committee for any additions before the end of February.

<u>AOB</u>

The Club Class Nationals 2020 was briefly discussed. No action was taken.

MP stated that Asselect required the committees approval to introduce a tick box to apply settings for competition airspace file downloads. This was agreed by the committee.
