

Delivered via a funded Project Manager – 1st March closing date!

The Reach for the Sky Challenge fund was announced by the Aviation Minister in July 2022, as a way of funding outreach programmes and events to educate young people from all backgrounds on the opportunities on offer in aviation.

Organisations meeting the criteria for the fund were able to apply for a share of £700,000, with funding decisions agreed by a joint panel of the Department for Transport (DfT) and the Civil Aviation Authority – which manages the fund on DfT's behalf.
